The Festival Orchestra at the Accordionists & Teachers Guild, International (ATG) annual gathering is always a highlight of the convention. This year, while celebrating their 80th Festival, the AT presented a spectacular 80-piece accordion orchestra under the baton of world renowned conductor, Joan Cochran Sommers.

Similar to how Symphony Orchestras function, each musician received the music in advance in order to prepare for the concert and three rehearsals were held at the Festival to put the orchestra together, and add timpani and percussion.

Concert Master for the orchestra was **Kevin Friedrich**, a past **ATG** President and current Ambassador to the **Confédération Internationale des Accordéonistes** (**CIA**), and along with musicians from as far afield as Italy (**CIA** President -- **Mirco Patarini**), Austria (First Vice President of the Harmonika Verband Österreichs -- HVÖ -- Dr. **Herbert Scheibenreif**), and throughout the United States and Canada, the magnificent concert drew accolades and a standing ovation from the audience, many of whom had never heard an accordion orchestra before.

Outside Group Policy Messiah Lutheran Church Open Up and Recover Safely Plan:



We ask that everyone who is entering the building wears a mask. The rule of thumb is:

IF YOU'RE MOVING, YOU'RE MASKING

- Once you are in place and safely distanced, you may remove your mask if you desire
- Groups are responsible for providing masks for their group members if they do not have their own
- Groups are responsible for proving their own hand sanitizer, gloves and disinfecting wipes
 to do the wipe down of touch points on the doors, bathrooms and surfaces used by their
 group during their activities.

Sanitation & Disinfecting of touch points: Wipe down all touchpoints used by group including but not limited to:

- Inside and outside door handles on all doors touched by group members
- · Restroom touchpoints including faucet handles and stall door touchpoints
- · Any chairs and or tables used by the group

Maintain Social Distancing

- Groups are asked to abstain from shaking hands and we encourage doing non-contact greetings.
- Seating should be set up to maintain proper spacing (family members from same household may sit together)
- If distancing cannot be assured, then masks should be worn
