### Outside Group Policy Messiah Lutheran Church Open Up and Recover Safely Plan:



• We ask that everyone who is entering the building wears a mask. The rule of thumb is:

### IF YOU'RE MOVING, YOU'RE MASKING

- Once you are in place and safely distanced, you may remove your mask if you desire
- Groups are responsible for providing masks for their group members if they do not have their own
