Plans are now being completed with special emphasis on new talent, new workshops, and new performances. Mark your calendar for this event, because it will be a great one. The convention schedule includes 42 workshops, 16 presenters, and 3 orchestras (Dick Albreski, conductor, Fun Band; Lorenzo Parker, conductor, Shelia Lee Memorial; Dick Albreski conductor, Youth Orchestra).
