# **October Meeting Minutes**

The Oklahoma Accordion Club held a meeting on Sunday, November 10, 2024. The location was Messiah Lutheran Church in OKC. Before the meeting began, Anne Lopez played "Kiss of Fire." Great "warm-up" music!

A small accordion was presented for sale, and several players took turns trying it out. The owner, Steve Corbin, is with a band. He gave our group tickets to their November 23 show in El Reno. Later, a member purchased his accordion.

President Maggie Abel called the meeting to order. Thirteen members and three guests were present. Our Treasurer and VP Ron Shearon led the Pledge of Allegiance. We sang the first verse of "America the Beautiful."

Ron showed us a large accordion that he bought at an estate sale. It originally weighed 75 pounds! He removed all the electronics and reduced it to a 31-pound instrument. He played "Song of the Volga Boatman."

Karen West performed "Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy From Company B." Karen had been unable to play for many weeks, and it was good to hear her again.

Dick Albreski played his accordion for us. Songs included "Besame Mucho," White Christmas,"
"Fascination," and "Just Because" with vocals. Dick joined Anne and Lois for two Spanish songs: "South of the Border," and "Spanish Eyes."

Maggie announced the plans for the December 8 Christmas party. There will be an auction to raise money for our Youth Group.
