Bless her heart, Irene learned which company Alex had bought it from, and decided to treat herself to a purple one also! It will arrive in a couple of months, and I can't wait to see it!

How much is too many? Or how many is too much? Accordions, that is.

Some may say, "You can only play one accordion at a time." True. But what if you have company, and your guest would like to try it out playing along with you? What if your accordion is temporarily in the shop, and you don't have a loaner to tide you over?

Our club VP & Treasurer, Ron Shearon, maintains more than a dozen squeezeboxes, some of which he uses for parts. Guitarists oftentimes have more than one guitar: a bass, a slide, a classical, a dobro, an accoustic, an electric, etc. Concert pianists like Virginia Campbell usually liked to keep two pianos on hand.

Where do you get spare accordions? Few music stores in OKC carry them. You might hafta go to an accordion convention such as the one we attend in Texas in March. Sometimes an accordion teacher has accumulated spares to rent or sell. Horn Trader (near Reno and Western) has a few shelves of various models that musicians have traded in. OAC members sometimes are selling one of theirs.

Sommers, Grayson Mansfield, Bridge & Wolak, Nicolay Bine, UMKC Community Accordion Ensemble, Mirco Patarini, Stas Venglevski and Das Kollektiv Duo. For best


